#### President's Report

The fiscal year ending Aug 21, 2023 was extremely uneventful. To a large extent, this was by design after CYSA directors and respective club representatives met and concluded that there was insufficient clarity on what the district should be doing and even less passion – particularly from me – to undertake any major initiatives on a voluntary basis and that if there was a desire or expectation for the District to take over any of the roles that clubs had been doing for years, it would mean contracting out or staffing at the District level and likely an increase in player registration fees to fund this. It was decided to leave that as an option going forward but that clubs would instead communicate amongst themselves on collective interests as they had done for so many years prior to the directive requiring us to form a district. That being the case, it was concluded that the CYSA would fulfil only the most basic role required by BC Soccer

To be honest I can say that as president I came up a little short fulfilling even some of the most basic requirements (like having a minimum of 6 meetings annually or having the AGM within 2 months of the fiscal year end...!)

I can also say that while we all agreed on the approach that was taken, board members at the club level are also volunteers, parents, coaches etc and that it shouldn't come as a surprise that it is difficult for them to add district initiatives to their plate even when they can serve the interests of their own respective clubs. I believe that if the CYSA is able to effectively identify collective interests, a more effective and energetic leadership can have a very big impact on helping clubs achieve these goals.

I think we all agree that there is an appetite for more inter-club play, more player opportunities and options and a need for bringing players from different clubs together in order to field more teams or make teams more competitive. It was great to see a team of U17 boys consisting of a good mix from Quesnel, 100 Mile and Williams Lake participating in the norther cup playdowns this past spring where none of the clubs would have been able to field a team on their own. I know that some of the new members are passionate about this and hope that they can build on this.

We have forwarded a copy of the application for admission into the district to the newly formed Lillooet Soccer club. They appear to be a very motivated, enthusiastic and

organized group and so I am hopeful that if their application is successful we will see the number of players in the Cariboo District increasing and the opportunity for more interclub play and player pooling to increase participation.

As I move on, I am hopeful and optimistic for the future of soccer in the Cariboo and would like to extend my thanks and encouragement to the new incoming board.
